Wrapped in White, Visions of Christmas Past John Doan Hearts of Space Records

One of the pleasures of the time surrounding Winter Solstice is the festive holiday music that fills the air. During this period we fill the CD player with our favorites:

Leon Redbone's Christmas Island, the Blue Yule compilation, An Austin Rhythm and Blues Christmas, Vision, the music of Hildegarde von Bingen and George Winston's December.

We're going to have to make room for a new crop of CDs this holiday season and I, for one, can hardly wait.

For starters there's Robin Spielberg's In the Heart of Winter. Spielberg's piano playing is graceful and deft. Her original compositions are evocative of the season, especially "Solstice Celebration," which is sure to become a holiday standard. When joined by string, flute and percussion accompaniment the music assumes a festive air, as

in "Christmas Day in the Morning" and "We Wish You a Merry Christmas," which feature various Celtic musicians.

Another solo pianist who has a holiday offering is John Boswell. His Festival of the Heart makes the perfect stocking stuffer for the music lover on your gift list. The two original offerings, "Festival of the Heart" and "Eastern Star," fit nicely with traditional odes like "Greensleeves," "Silent Night" and "Angels We Have Heard on High." The accompaniment is sublimely understated and avoids rank sentimentality.

On Wrapped in White, Visions of Christmas
Past, John Doan uses authentic 19th century
instruments to conjure a romantic vision
of the season. Harp guitar, harmonium,
Mandobass and Ukelin (!) are some of the
instruments used. Doan's treatments of favorite carols include "O Christmas Tree,"
"Silent Night" and "Auld Lang Syne."
